

PICNIC RESERVATION PROCEDURES AND RULES

- Picnic areas can be reserved online at PleasantonFun.com
- Weekly picnic reservation reports with approved permits will be posted on the City of Pleasanton website.
- Bring a copy of your Picnic Reservation Receipt with you on the day of your event
- Special events in the parks and picnic areas may be charged an additional \$1000 Damage Deposit

1. Reservation Fee Payment

Full payment of picnic reservation fees must be made at the time of online in in-person booking. Checks should be made payable to the City of Pleasanton. Cash, VISA, MasterCard, Discover, and AMEX are also accepted.

2. Cancellation Policy

All cancellations must be in writing by the applicant by emailing <u>recreation@cityofplesantonca.gov</u>. The cancellation fees are as follows:

- Requests received at least 30 days prior to a scheduled picnic will incur a \$50 cancellation fee
- Requests received less than 30 days prior to a scheduled picnic will forfeit 75% of the picnic reservation fee
- Requests received within 10 days prior to a scheduled picnic will forfeit 100% of the picnic reservation fees
- The Security Deposit will be fully refunded.
- Reservations may not be transferred, assigned, or sublet.

3. Rain Cancellations

Picnic reservation fees will not be refunded for events which are cancelled due to rain, although you can reschedule a date (due to inclement weather) if notification of rain cancellation was communicated to the Library and Recreation Department in writing by the applicant by emailing recreation@cityofplesantonca.gov at least 3 days before the schedule reservation.

• Events cancelled due to rain may be rescheduled for a future use to occur within one-year (12 months) of the cancelled date of use.

4. Certificate of Liability Insurance

Applicants may be required to provide the City of Pleasanton with a valid Certificate of Liability Insurance if your picnic falls into a "Special Event" category, i.e. is open to the public, includes outside vendors such as gaming or entertainment trucks, or caterers.

5. Security Deposit

If at any time during the reservation the below rules are not followed, it may result in the forfeiture of the security deposit.

6. The City of Pleasanton reserves the right to reschedule, relocate, or deny a request previously approved. In those cases, the renter will be given as much notice as possible, and all fees paid will be refunded.

Picnic Area General Rules

Advertising

No posting of advertising, petitions circulated, or solicitations can be made in any park.

Amplified Sound/Noise

No amplified music or PA system is allowed in any park.

Barbecues

- Group barbecues are provided in picnic areas. Coals and ashes are to be left in the BBQ and should not be dumped in the trash receptacles.
- Portable barbecues are allowed. A fire permit must be obtained for such a barbecue. Please contact the Fire Department at 925-454-2361 to obtain your Fire Permit. Sterno canisters are allowed without a Fire Permit.

Business Licenses

A City of Pleasanton Business License is required for all businesses (caterers, food trucks, interactive trucks, entertainers) performing a service at a City of Pleasanton park and facility. If necessary, please contact the Business License Department at 925-931-5440.

Clean Up/Trash

Any food, debris, litter, trash, decorations, games, etc., must be properly disposed of prior to leaving the picnic area.

Decorations/Signs

Signage, posters, or banners may not be attached to any park structures, including walls, trash receptacles, columns, trees, and light posts. All signs must comply with City sign ordinance. A-frame or sandwich boards are allowed.

Pets

Dogs are to be retrained by substantial leash not to exceed six feet in length. Persons with dogs must dispose of waste.

Prohibited Items

- Alcoholic beverages are NOT allowed in Pleasanton Parks.
- ATV Vehicles
- Chalk, decals, silly string, powders, wax paint, etc.
- Glass containers, including bottles
- Animal rides, petting zoos, ponies
- Dunk tanks and Human Hamster Balls/Zorb Balls
- Inflatable jump equipment
- Selling, vending or peddling items
- Stakes may not be used to hold down canopies; they will cause damage to our grass/fields areas.
 Alternatives: adhere canopy to cooler, sandbags, or water buckets
- Tarps
- SMOKING IS NOT ALLOWED AT ANY CITY PARKS, INCLUDING PATHWAYS THROUGH THE PARK; TRAILS; AND PARKING LOTS ADJACENT TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES.

Deposits will be forfeited for noncompliance.

Vehicles

No vehicles are to be driven or parked on walkways, patios, or turf areas. Deposits will be forfeited for noncompliance.
